Jean Anna Feit passed away peacefully on June 27, 2019. Her husband Walter awaits her in heaven along with a son, Steven. Even from the moment she was born premature, to Arthur and Edna Dudley, she was incredible. Most premature babies passed away at that time, but she was fortunate enough to be born near Coney Island, where Dr. Couney had the world's first incubators, and she became a 3 pound sensation that people would gather and pay 25 cents just to see. She always got a kick out of what people called, "The Freak Show."

Jean Dudley was 16 when she got married and became the matriarch of the Feit family by giving birth to her first son, Walter, followed by 6 more, Lawrence, Steven, Brian, Martin, and finally twins Mark and Matthew. She was lucky enough to be surrounded for most of her life by many of her loved ones which even included a great great grandchild. She had 4 siblings, Carol, Anna (Sissy,) Lillian (Lily,) and Johnny, who gave her many nieces and nephews. She moved from Brooklyn to Queens, until finally she moved to Hannacroix, NY in 1969 and stayed there for a large portion of her life.

Jean was extremely talented and creative, a great cook and extremely generous and loving. She was a cook at Mary's Restaurant and a baker at Shepard's Resort She was known for her cream puffs and pound cake but was able to make anything delicious. She loved it when her children came to visit and would always say "The more the merrier". She threw the best family reunions where people would travel for hours just to attend. She often told jokes and great stories to her grandkids.

In her later life, she moved to Florida, near her sister Lily, where they frequented brunches and flea markets. She was an extremely social and active woman, even finding time to go parasailing in her 70's. One thing she loved more than making things, was giving them away to friends and family. It was rare to leave her home without a few trinkets to take home. From jewelry, to hand sewn dolls, and even a sheep that pooped jelly beans, she would give you things that were made with love and extreme talent.

She wasn't only generous to people. She loved her animals and adopted many over the years, often those lost or hurt, even including a raccoon and a baby bear. She would often have multiple dogs, cats and birds. She even had a pet crow that would come back and visit her daily.

Jean was loved by many, and she may be gone, but she is not forgotten. She will be missed by so many, but we will remember her for the strong independent woman she was, all the way into her mid-80s.
